1. OPENING

The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m. with prayer and devotional by Bro. Reginald. Nancy welcomed all present and asked each member to introduce themselves.

The prayer and devotion will be led by Canon Stephen at the next Advisory Board meeting.

Election of Secretary: Cassandra Culpepper was appointed as Secretary of the Advisory Board for the year 2021.

Election of Chair Person: Robin Pacific was appointed as Chair of the Advisory Board for the year 2021.

2. INCUMBENT'S COMMENTS

Canon Stephen welcomed the new members of the Board and thanked those who previously served. He noted that the Advisory Board meets at 7:30 p.m. every third Tuesday of the month except during the months of July, August and December.

He encouraged member of the Advisory Board to serve on committees and working groups.

He noted that the annual leadership workshop will be held virtually and encouraged all members to attend. The date for the annual leadership workshop for our episcopal area is to be determined.

3. ORIENTATION, REPORTS & DISCUSSION

BOARD ORIENTATION

Rebecca gave a brief presentation of the Board Orientation highlighting topics which included Board's role, Chair's role and guidelines.

4. OTHER BUSINESS

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

On a motion duly moved, seconded and carried, the minutes of the meeting held on January 19, 2021 was confirmed.

MATTERS ARISING

There were no matters arising from the previous minutes.

CHURCH WARDENS' REPORT

Nancy gave a brief presentation of the Church Wardens' report and highlighted the following items:

- **Auditor's report:** Awaiting receipt of the audited report
- **TKNS:** The nursery school remained closed and a thorough cleaning was scheduled to be carried out at HTC.
- Re-opening of HTC: Noted that the Wardens were looking at reopening HTC.
- Lawn maintenance
- **Rejuvenation project:** The Wardens will be writing the Diocese to inform of HTC's reopening protocols.
- Unaudited Financial Statements: Ed gave a brief report of the unaudited financial statements for the period ending February 28, 2021. He noted that the income reflected a balance of \$49,000 and expenses recorded a balance of \$93,000 which resulted in a deficit of \$44,000 for the first couple of months of the year and this was as a consequence of payment of the insurance which was due in February 2021. He continued to note that envelopes receipts were \$8,000 which were below the budget amount of \$14,000.

INCUMBENT'S REPORT

Canon Stephen highlighted the following items in his report

- **Ministerial Lenten Series:** The 53rd edition of our Ministerial Lenten Series themed "The Gospel in a Time of Pandemic" will conclude on March 21, 2021 with The Rev. Peter Lisinski.
- Lenten Readings and Offerings: The Lenten readings were the Second Letter to the Corinthians. Canon Stephen recommended that the Lenten offerings collected this year be donated to the Mosiac/Out of the Cold/Blue Doors program.
- In-Person Worship: Canon Stephen noted that many clergy in our episcopal area were considering restarting face to face worship on Palm Sunday or Easter and proposed that HTC makes plans to return to in-person worship on Palm Sunday.

COMMITTEES & MINISTRY AREAS

Anglican Church Women

Linda Robertson gave a brief update of the ACW noting that they were struggling with ways to raise funds. She stated that it was doubtful that the rummage sale will be held in the Fall. The Annual General Meeting of the ACW will be held on April 17, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. with Linda Nichols, Primate is expected to be in attendance.

ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Ed stated that the Lenten messages were inspiring and noted that he had asked the Incumbent if the video clips could be compiled as a package.

Canon Stephen noted that he was disappointed that the parish had not thanked the lay members who went above and beyond during the past year. Rebecca noted that people do not know that persons have been going into the church which gave rise to how HTC was communicating to its parishioners. It was noted that the Wardens and the Chair of the Advisory Board should address this issue on at a Sunday service.

Incumbent's Report

COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS

 Today's announcement from the Provincial government once again returned the Diocese of Toronto to our Red Stage Guidelines. The Bishop's office has advised that effective Monday, April 19th, our churches are limited to 10 people present for all worship services, indoors or outdoors, including weddings and funerals. Until otherwise directed, clergy and others should only access our buildings, observing all protocols including mask-wearing and physical distancing, primarily for the provision of livestreaming or filming worship, to a maximum of ten people present.

LEADERSHIP WORKSHOP

EPISCOPAL LEADERSHIP WORKING GROUP REPORT/TOWN HALL MEETING

- In June of 2020, following the announcement of the retirement of the Rt. Rev. Peter Fenty, Bishop Andrew Asbil announced the formation of the Episcopal Leadership Working Group (the ELWG) with a mandate to consider and report to him on alternative models for the exercise of episcopal leadership, oversight, and pastoral ministry within the Diocese of Toronto. The Report was submitted on Shrove Tuesday. Members of the diocese have been invited to read the Report, watch a video from Bishop Asbil, give their feedback, and sign up for Town Hall meetings in May to discuss the Report with the Bishop.
